

### **The Reflection**

REFLECTION ON MT.18:21-35. Forgiveness not seven times "but, I tell you, seventy - seven times".

One wonders what had happened for Peter to approach Jesus and ask that question about the limits of forgiveness. Usually we do not think about forgiveness in the abstract. We think about it because we have been hurt, "sinned against", as Peter says.

Forgiveness has been described as "letting go of our hope for a different past". That is, a process of both being aware of past matters but no longer holding on to them. As we all know, this is easier said than done!

Again, here I find the Jesus Prayer so practical and powerful. The reminder of the past appears in the mind. Instead of following that thought and becoming absorbed in a foolish hope for a different past, one places in one's mind "Jesus have mercy" and stays in the reality of the here and now.

The truth of this pertains both to what has been done to us and also what troubles us from our own past behaviour.

As we also know, it is sometimes harder to forgive ourselves than it is to forgive someone else.

Even after we have prayed thousands of times, in Holy Communion, “We thank you that on the cross Jesus took away our sin , all that keeps us from each other and from you. He frees us from hate and fear, from all that destroys love and trust”.( APBA p.139).

We are so free .

We are...

Embodying this is so vital now. Yes, as we give thanks to God in our Collect, for the “good news of your love “. As has also been said recently, “we all need to apologise and we all need to forgive, for humanity to have a sustainable future.

Otherwise we are controlled by the past, individually and corporately. History then “easily devolves into taking sides, bitterness, holding grudges, and the violence that inevitably follows. (Richard Rohr).

We have seen enough of that! Hence, we are called to face what it takes to change this pattern, recognising that not everything that is faced can easily be changed; but “nothing can be changed until it is faced. “(James Baldwin).

Praying, as we are, for the “healing of our land “obviously therefore involves our apologising and forgiving, in the amazing grace of Jesus .

The word “Behold “has emerged in our recent prayer conversations with Indigenous Christian elders.

In her book “Silence: A User’s Guide”, Maggie Ross says that ‘behold’ is a word that “alerts us to pause, however briefly, to be vigilant because something new, something startling, is about to be revealed. Beholding is a process of continual death (the mind being temporarily brought to silence) and resurrection (the arrival of a new perspective). If we live in beholding, we continually live in a new creation” (p.129).

“Behold! I have given you every herb.. and every tree ..and every beast.. and every fowl... and everything that creepeth.. “says God to Adam and Eve after creating and blessing them. ( Genesis 1:29-30).

So says God to us, as we “ behold “ now the beauty of spring flowers and their fragrance .

“ Behold! You shall conceive .” ( Luke 1:31)

“ Behold ! I bring you good tidings. ( Luke 2:10)

“ Behold! The Lamb of God.” ( John 1:29)

“ Behold! The hour comes”.(John 16 :32)

“Behold! I show you a mystery.” ( 1 Cor 15:51)

And , yes.” Behold ! He is coming with the clouds and everyone shall see him.  
“Rev. 1:7).

Our “ beholding “ of all God’s glory and our praying for the “ healing of our land  
“ is enhanced as we practice Jesus teaching about forgiveness, here and now.

This large shrub is a Ceanothus, with a stunning pale blue flower and a light honey scent: botanical name

*C. arboreus* 'Trewithen Blue'. Beloved of bees and little honeyeaters. Right now it is blooming its head off in my tiny garden and will keep doing so for some weeks. It has been in the garden for about five years, and is now about twelve feet high by nearly as much across. It gives glory to God! (As indeed do all our green and growing

things...and my cat..!) For those more accustomed to the round-shaped, very dark blue Ceanothus, this one may come as a real surprise. You may also notice that at the Church, our super landscaper planted many of the small, variegated prostrate Ceanothus (*C. griseus* var. *horizontalis* 'Diamond Heights') which also has pale blue flowers, and lovely lime- and darker-green foliage. You can get

that one from Wombat Gully. I have one here, and it's doing wonderfully well in a large pot on the little front porch. Helen Modra.
